



Today's Readings

Romans 8.12-17

¹²So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh? ¹³for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. ¹⁴For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. ¹⁵For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, 'Abba! Father!' ¹⁶it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, ¹⁷and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ? If, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

John 3. 1-17


¹There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. ²He came to

Jesus by night and said to him, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God.' ³Jesus answered him, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above.' ⁴Nicodemus said to him, 'How can anyone be born after having grown old? Can one enter a second time into the mother's womb and be born?' ⁵Jesus answered, 'Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit. ⁶What is born of the flesh is flesh, and what is born of the Spirit is spirit. ⁷Do not be astonished that I said to you, "You must be born from above." ⁸The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.' ⁹Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?' ¹⁰Jesus answered him, 'Are you a teacher of Israel, and yet you do not understand these things?

¹¹'Very truly, I tell you, we speak of what we know and testify to what we have seen; yet you do not receive our testimony. ¹²If I have told you about earthly things and you do not believe, how can you believe if I tell you about heavenly things? ¹³No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man. ¹⁴And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. ¹⁷Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.'

We will be filling in the **Fairer Share** form in May to calculate what we as parishes contribute to the Diocese. Each parish will be running their own programme. It was three years ago the survey was last completed and all regular attendees are highly encouraged to submit the form. You cannot be identified as all forms are submitted into a sealed box which will not be opened by anyone within our Benefice. We need to achieve a 75% response rate for the survey to be accurate otherwise HMRC data will be used. Three years ago this happened in Inkberrow resulting in a very high calculation which was only mitigated by special negotiation which we do not believe we can count on again. It is imperative that we all contribute to this effort to calculate a fair estimate of what each parish should be contributing.
