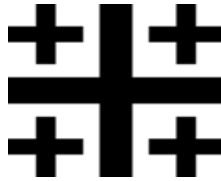

World Day for International Justice (from Prayer Diary)

Today is the twentieth anniversary of the founding of the International Criminal Court (ICC) in 2002. The idea of an international tribunal was first mooted after the First World War. Temporary international courts were set up after the Second World War, and again after the genocides in the former Yugoslavia, and in Rwanda.

Many countries still dislike the idea of a permanent court that could, in theory, hold them accountable. It is resisted in both small dictatorships and large superpowers like China and the United States.

Underpinning it is the idea that there is a higher law above the laws of particular nations, and that no nation state should declare legal anything that goes against that higher law. There are such things as crimes against humanity. For the Christian,

and for any theist, that higher law has its origin not in abstract concepts of justice, but in the goodness and justice of God.

Pray today for the ICC. Pray that all nations will only enact just laws, and enforce them only on criminals, and not on minorities or political opponents. Pray that all states will learn to co-operate more fully in promoting justice within their own borders and between nations.
